### THE CHRISTIANS AT ANTIOCH

---

**LESSON TEXT:** *Acts 11:19-30*

**LESSON SETTING:** Disciples made trips to towns like Cyprus and Antioch and other areas north of Jerusalem where persecutions dispersed the Christians.

**TIME:** Approximately 43 AD

---

  4. Exhorts to godliness. (vs. 23) 1 Timothy 4:7
  5. Is a good man. (vs. 24)
  6. Is full of faith, given by the Holy Spirit. (vs. 24) 1 John 5:4
  7. Recognizes and uses the talents of others. (vs. 25, 26)
  8. Willing to give time for teaching. (vs. 26)

**QUARTERLY THEME:** The First Church Officers

**TOPIC:** PETER DELIVERED FROM PRISON

**INTRODUCTION:**

The persecution worsens under Herod Agrippa and now James (one of the original twelve) becomes the first apostle to be killed. Peter is once again put into prison and, humanly speaking, was certain to be number two. The church had gone "under cover" in Jerusalem and nothing more could be done but to gather together secretly and pray for the impossible to happen.

Would King Herod order the believers exterminated one by one until those remaining renounced their faith? Should they, too, leave families and friends and flee Jerusalem as many others had done? What about the impending famine prophesied by Agabus?

**CENTRAL TRUTH:** God is able to deliver His people and bring victory out of seeming defeat.

**GOLDEN TEXT:** *HE DELIVERETH AND RESCUETH, AND HE WORKETH SIGNS AND WONDERS IN HEAVEN AND IN EARTH.*

Daniel 6:27

How strengthening were such scriptural promises delivered to the church in their Old Testaments! With the Word in their hearts and minds, an undying hope inspired them to pray instantly and earnestly.

We in America, perhaps not even to this time, have come into such persecutions where we experience the promises of this golden text. Yet in many other areas of the world, Christians do experience the mighty hand of God working out their deliverance from many trying experiences. How often we read accounts of praise to God for the promises of this verse. The missionary accounts of the work in all areas of the world are good examples of God's blessings in times of tribulation.
