**QUARTERLY THEME:** David the King

**TOPIC:** TRUSTING IN THE LORD

**INTRODUCTION:**

Into the lives of every person comes moments of despair when he feels that all is lost and there is no way of escape.

Next Sunday's lesson is concerned with the answer of a child of God to just such a situation. It deals with a song that David sang in which he tells of agony (Psalm 40:12), hope and trust (Psalm 40:4-11, 13) and salvation (Psalm 40:1-3).

The lesson title, "TRUSTING IN THE LORD" does not, at first impression, convey the very complex and difficult task one is faced with in teaching this trust to someone who is in need. When two people, already have such trust, on the other hand, it is easy to discuss the subject and compare personal experiences.

Use of a Christian's God-given facilities is also necessary in our dealings with others. If someone merely says, "trust in the Lord" instead of extending a helping hand, he is missing the whole point of true Christian living. (Ref. James 2:15-16)

As applies by David, his trust in the Lord was so great that he did not doubt that he would eventually be saved from his moment of despair. The application of such a trusting spirit is possible and expected in the life of each Christian.

**CENTRAL TRUTH:** Faith in God finds expression in joyful witness to His greatness in salvation.

**GOLDEN TEXT:** *BLESSED IS THE MAN THAT MAKETH THE LORD HIS TRUST.*

Psalm 40:4a

The manifestations of trust in God in the lives of Christians are evident in their actions. If a man has such trust he will not concern himself with his ability to cope with problems of life, whether they be of school, work, physical needs or anything else. He completely yields himself to God.

On the other hand, a Christian living according to God's will is not lazy in the use of his God-given facilities, giving as his excuse, "I'm trusting in the Lord." Each person is expected to devote himself whole-heartedly into finding the solution to his problems and to the using of his strength (God-given) to overcome adversity. Someone once said, "God helps those who help themselves." While this may not always be the case (one must also believe in Him), it does point out that there cannot be much sympathy for someone who just sits and wrings his hands in times of adversity, bemoaning his fate.
