

## QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

1. Was Abram forced to leave his homeland or did God give him a choice?
2. Were Abram and his family familiar with the land to which they were directed?
3. What were some of the promises to Abram if he obeyed the call of God?
4. Was God faithful to Abram? Is He faithful to us? If so, are there any special conditions?

### SUMMARY:

Abram's father moved his family to a new land. They started out for Canaan but settled in Haran. God wanted Abram in Canaan, and after Terah's death, God made an ever lasting proposition with him. In great faith, he accepted God's promise, and we see a covenant made which has lasted throughout the centuries. God, of course, kept His word, but in Abram we see an outstanding example of one who took God at His word and never doubted. His faith in God made him great. A right relationship with God allows Him to use us to the fulfillment of His will.

### THE BEGINNING OF A NATION

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**LESSON TEXT:** *Genesis 11:31 through 12:9; Acts 7:1-8*

**LESSON SETTING:** Abram went from Ur to Haran (in Turkey near the Syrian border). God called him from Haran.

**TIME:** Approximately 1950 BC

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#### I. GOD'S CALL. Genesis 11:31-32; 12:1

**QUARTERLY THEME:** The Beginnings

**TOPIC:** ABRAM AND LOT

**INTRODUCTION:**

How very human it is for each of us to see that we are given what we want. If a choice is placed before us we take that which is most desirable. It is divine to be as Abram was. It takes an unselfish heart, one void of conceit and self-centeredness to take the shorter end.

Man is placed on this earth with a will of his own, with the power to make a choice. The world upholds that person that can make what it calls wise choices, choices that bring him gain in material things. The man who chooses to live for God and ignore worldly attractions for great gain is considered foolish by the world.

Lot showed human worldly wisdom in making his choice. Abram showed humble divine wisdom. But the result of these choices proved which one really had done wisely and had received God's blessings. We read much of Abram's descendants throughout the Bible, but little is mentioned of Lot's.

How much happier each individual would be if he, like Abram, is wise enough to take the shorter end.

**CENTRAL TRUTH:** Being both unselfish and a peacemaker go far in making the right choice.

**GOLDEN TEXT: *THE LORD IS MERCIFUL AND GRACIOUS, SLOW TO ANGER, AND PLENTEOUS IN MERCY.***

Psalm 103:8

The Psalmist was looking back to the beginning of God's nation, Israel, and remembering the many times His people had turned from His ways, and yet how God had always forgiven them when they turned back to Him in repentance and godly fear. We know that God was "*slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy*" toward Israel, because of the promises which he had made to Abraham when he was yet Abram. Although He often punished them because of their idolatry and wickedness, whenever a righteous man prayed for them and they turned from evil, He always forgave them. So David was moved to write also, "*He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities. For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is His mercy toward them that fear Him.*" (Psalm 103:10-11)
